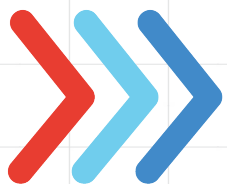

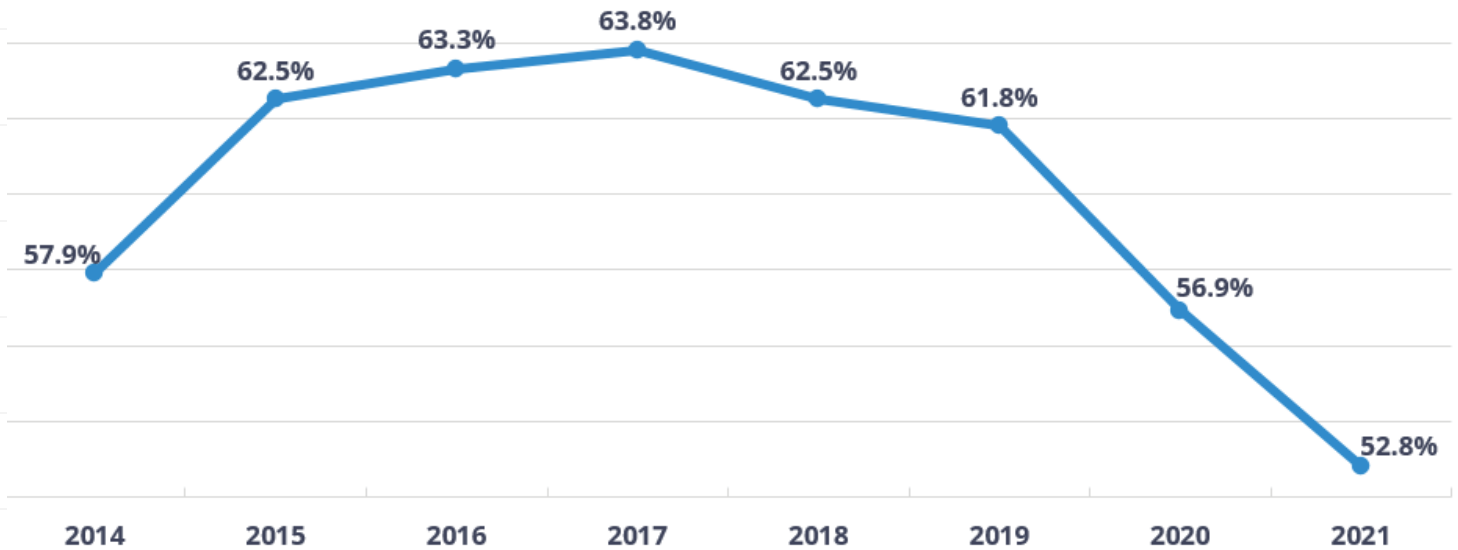

TENNESSEE COLLEGE-GOING RATES

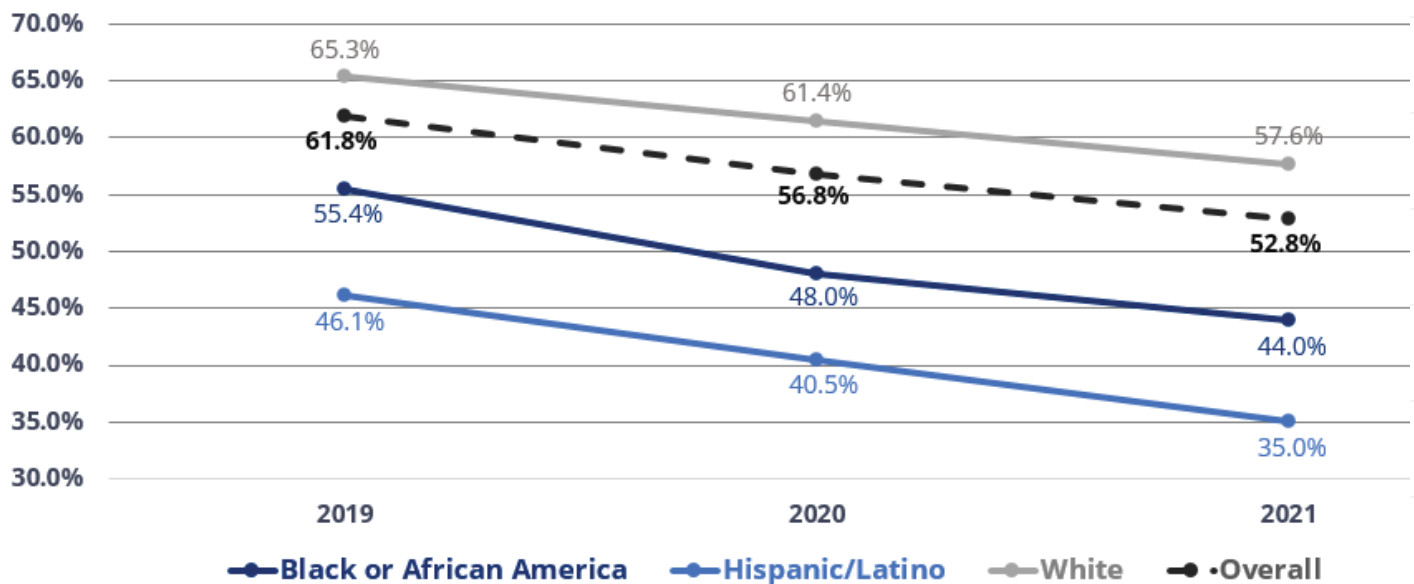
The Tennessee Higher Education Commission (THEC) produces the college-going rate (CGR) for the recent public high school graduating class each year. The college-going rate represents the percentage of public high school graduates who enroll in college in the summer or fall immediately after high school. Tennessee’s college-going rate for the Class of 2021 was 52.8 percent.

The college-going rate has fluctuated in the past decade, increasing alongside implementation of Tennessee Promise, and declining incrementally over the past five years. Following the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic there was a nine-percentage point drop over a two-year period which was disproportionately felt by students of color. THEC’s inaugural report, College-Going and the Class of 2021, and data files with school-level college-going rates are available to view and download on THEC’s website.

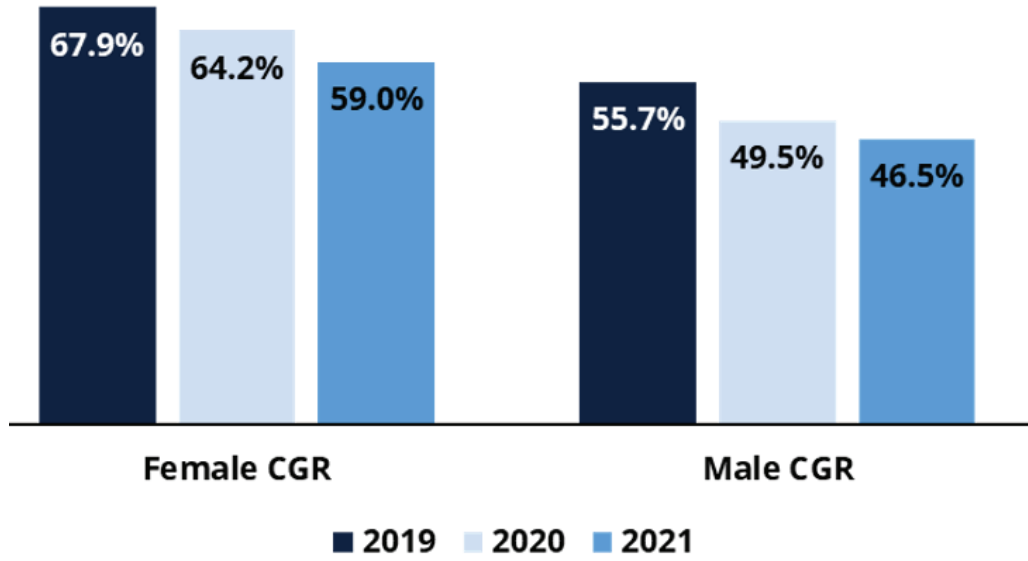
TENNESSEE COLLEGE-GOING RATE DECLINE



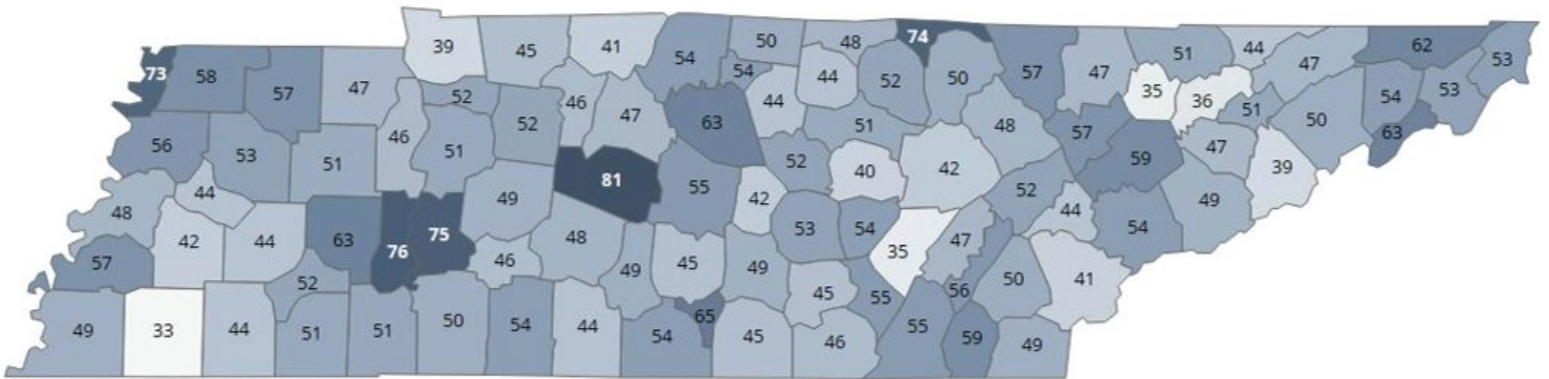
DISPARITIES BY RACE WIDENING



MALE COLLEGE-GOING RATE CONTINUES TO TRAIL FEMALE COLLEGE-GOING RATE

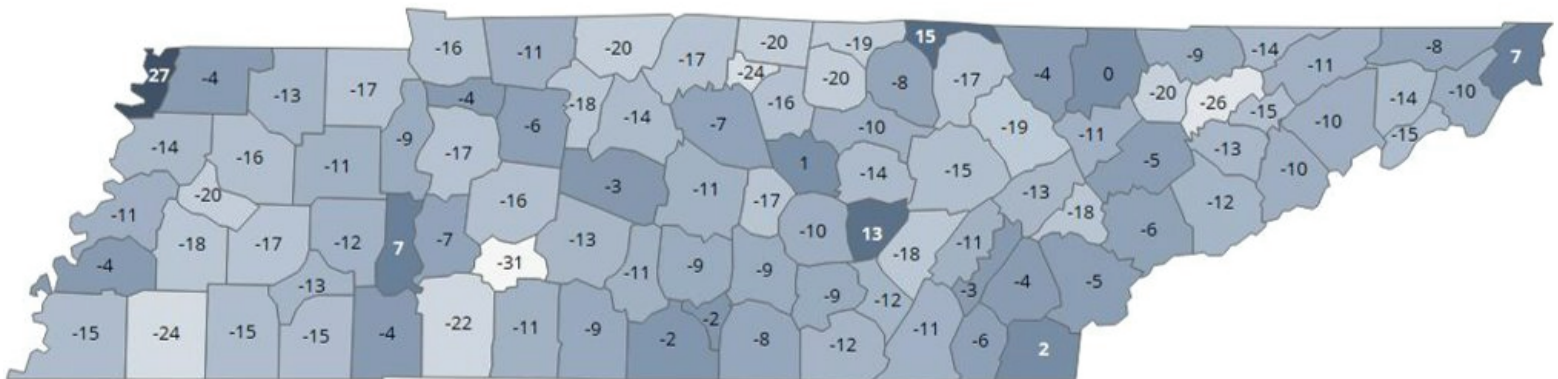


GEOGRAPHIC DISPARITIES PERSIST FOR THE CLASS OF 2021
