DUAL ENROLLMENT GRANT (DEG)

- The legislative intent of the DEG program is to allow high school students to earn a technical credential or a semester of college credit prior to high school graduation, free of tuition and fee
- Student must be a high school junior or senior; **or** be a high school student who is enrolled at a TCAT

DUAL ENROLLMENT GRANT (DEG)

- **Students must apply, each academic year.**

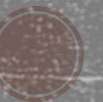
- **Deadline Dates:**

Two-year and Four-year Eligible Postsecondary Institutions:

- September 15 – Fall Semester
- February 1 – Spring Semester
- May 15 – Summer Semester

Tennessee College of Applied Technology Institutions:

- November 1 – Fall Trimester
- March 1 – Spring Trimester
- May 15 – Summer



DUAL ENROLLMENT GRANT (DEG)

- To remain academically eligible beyond the first semester of receiving the DEG, students must achieve a minimum 2.0 college GPA as determined by the institution
- For the first five (5) dual enrollment semester courses, the DEG award amount is the average in-state tuition determined by TBR for a community college, plus a 5% dual enrollment access fee
- For semester courses 6-10, TSAC will determine the award amount per credit hour

DUAL ENROLLMENT GRANT (DEG)

- Eligible public institutions **shall not charge** a student receiving DEG tuition or fees in excess of the student's DEG award.
- Eligible public institutions **may charge** a student receiving DEG costs incurred by the institution on the student's behalf, such as but not limited to:
 - Book and material costs
 - Digital book and material costs
 - Special examination fees
 - Industry certification fees
 - Board examination fees

DUAL ENROLLMENT GRANT (DEG)

- “Tuition” **does not include** any other fees assessed by the institution to its students including but not limited to:
 - Mandatory fees
 - Online or technology fees
 - Application fees
 - Book or material fees
 - Access fees
 - Course fees
 - Fees charged to students for a specific purpose
 - Activity fees
 - Facility fees
 - Service fees

DUAL ENROLLMENT GRANT (DEG)

Award amounts for **courses 1 – 5 at 2-Year & 4-Year schools**
(*5% Dual Enrollment Access Fee)

DUAL ENROLLMENT GRANT (DEG)

High school students may receive the DEG for no more than:

- Ten (10) courses at institutions that offer degrees; **and**
- 1,296 clock hours at TCATs

MIDDLE COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP

- High school junior or senior pursuing an associate degree
- Must receive the award as a high school junior and have earned a minimum 3.0 high school GPA at the end of the sophomore year
- Must maintain a minimum 3.0 college GPA
- \$2,000 per semester (\$4,000 per year)
- Must enroll full-time as a middle college student at one of the eligible community colleges

MIDDLE COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP

Terminating Events:

- Student fails to maintain a minimum 3.0 college GPA,
- Student fails to maintain full-time enrollment,
- Two (2) years have passed from the date of enrollment as a middle college student, **OR**
- Student earns an associate degree or graduates from high school

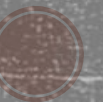
