TENNESSEE FINANCIAL AID

You might be eligible for the following scholarships as a Tennessee resident

TN PROMISE
TN Promise is a **last-dollar scholarship** covering **all tuition and mandatory fees** for an associate degree or certificate at any Tennessee College of Applied Technology (TCAT) or community college. **Some tuition and fees** are also covered at some four-year institutions.

TN HOPE SCHOLARSHIP
The HOPE Scholarship can provide up to **\$4,500 per year** for a four-year degree. You must have a **21 ACT** or a **3.0 GPA** when you graduate from high school to earn this scholarship.

GENERAL ASSEMBLY MERIT SCHOLARSHIP (GAMS)
GAMS can provide up to **\$1,000 per year** for students who earn a minimum **3.75 GPA** and a **29 ACT**.

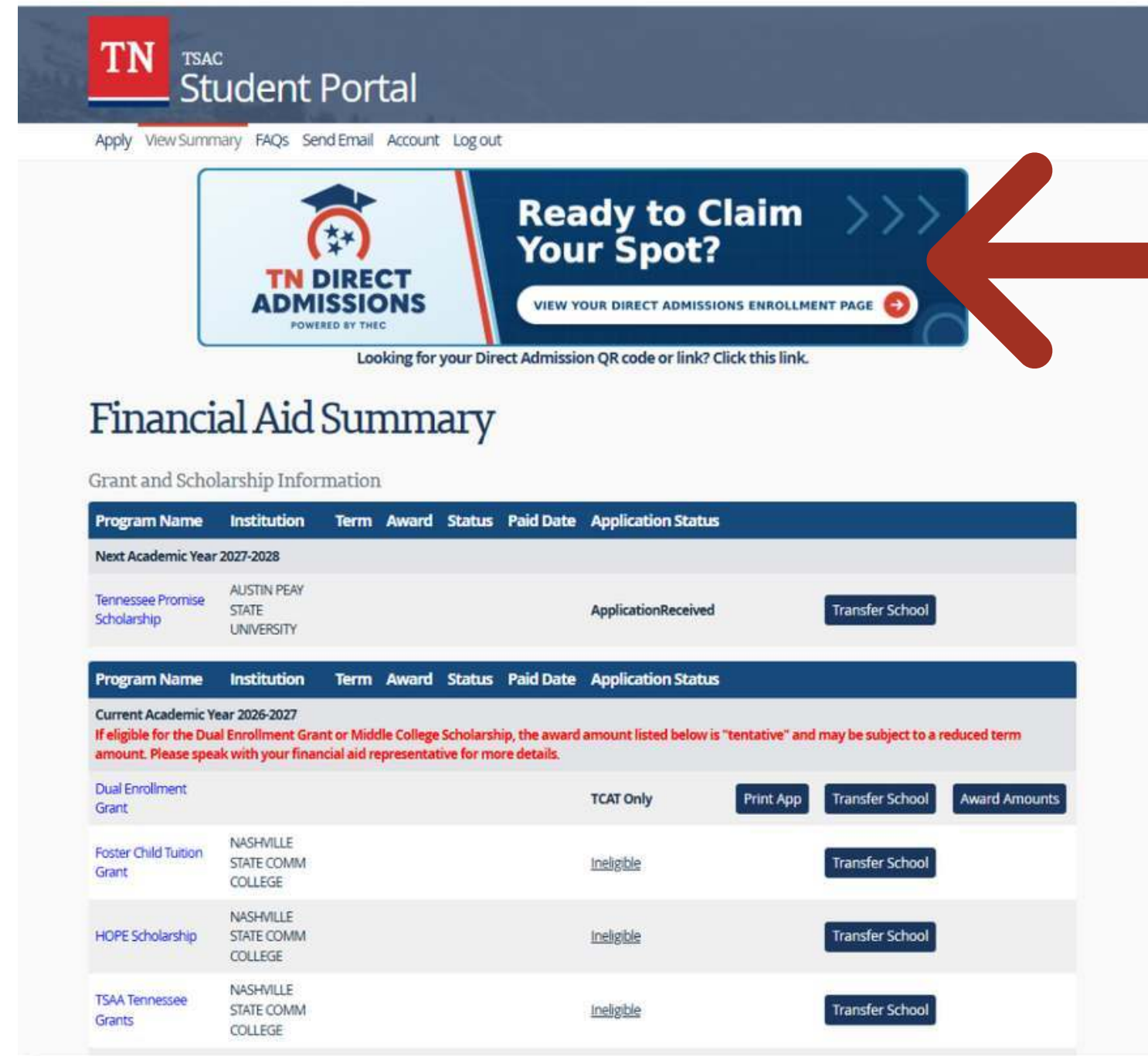

- **TN HOPE Scholarship:** The HOPE Scholarship can provide **up to \$4,500** in aid per year to cover tuition, fees, and other expenses over the course of your studies at a four-year institution and **up to \$3,200** per year at one of Tennessee's community colleges. You must have a **21 ACT or a 3.0 GPA** when you graduate from high school to earn this scholarship.

TCATs specialize in hands-on training that leads directly to relevant careers. TCAT programs are focused, skill-based, and typically take months—not years—to complete. Students learn in real-world settings using industry-standard equipment in areas such as advanced manufacturing, automotive technology, health sciences, information technology, and other skilled trades. With a strong record of job placement, TCATs are an excellent choice for students who want to enter the workforce quickly with the confidence and skills to succeed. TCATs award short- and long-term certificates and industry credentials. These can take anywhere from a few months to a few years to complete.

And remember, all tuition and mandatory fees at TCATs are covered by Tennessee Promise!

Community colleges provide opportunities in fields like healthcare, business, engineering, technology, education, and more. Community colleges mostly award associate degrees, which typically take 2 or more years to complete.

Moore College of Technology is a non-profit technical college that offers practical, affordable training designed to prepare students for skilled careers in fields such as HVAC, automotive service, welding, industrial electricity, machining, and property maintenance. Programs are hands-on and focused on real-world experience, with small class sizes and instructors who bring industry knowledge to the classroom. Students can complete certificates, diplomas, or associate-level programs in approximately one to two years, with flexible scheduling options to support working adults. William R. Moore College of Technology provides a direct pathway to technical careers through workforce-aligned programs and job placement support.

William R. Moore College of Technology is Tennessee Promise eligible, meaning the Tennessee Promise will cover a portion of your tuition and fees.

Tennessee's public and private universities offer a wide range of academic programs that prepare students for careers, graduate school, and leadership in their communities. These institutions provide a comprehensive college experience, with opportunities for research, internships, campus involvement, and study abroad. Students can pursue bachelor's degrees in fields such as business, education, engineering, the arts, sciences, and more. Universities often offer specialized facilities, expert faculty, and strong alumni networks that support long-term success. Most bachelor's degree programs take about four years to complete, and many universities also offer pathways to advanced degrees. Some universities also offer shorter programs, like associate degrees.

* Disclaimer:

All offers of admission and all financial aid estimates listed are based on the information you have provided or your high school record and are contingent on earning a Traditional High School Diploma and maintaining any applicable eligibility requirements. While education and training after high school will always include additional costs or expenses beyond tuition (for example: books, tools, parking, housing and meals if staying on campus), it can be much more affordable than you think thanks to grants and scholarships in Tennessee. You may be eligible for additional state, federal, or institutional aid, and you will be notified about this after you complete the FAFSA. Need-based aid may be available through the state for up to \$4,000 per year, and through the federal government for up to \$7,395 per year. Don't let the prices you see online scare you. Student Acknowledgment and Information Summary

- **Academic Testing:** As a student, you may be required to take certain academic assessments during your time at the college. These tests help the college evaluate and improve instruction. Some tests may be administered by outside organizations, and your results may be shared with the college. All test results will be kept confidential as required by law.
- **Campus Safety and Legal Requirements:** Tennessee law requires individuals who are registered sex offenders to notify the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) if they enroll, work, or volunteer at a college. Forms and more information are available through the Office of Safety and Security.
- **Accuracy of Application:** Providing false or incomplete information on your application may affect your admission or continued enrollment. By applying, you agree to follow the college's rules and policies.
- **Use of Social Security Number:** Providing your Social Security number is voluntary. If you choose not to provide it, you'll be assigned a special student ID number. However, your Social Security number is required for financial aid and some federal reporting purposes. It will be kept private and only used according to college policy.
- **State Benefit Eligibility:** Tennessee law requires students applying for in-state tuition or state financial aid to confirm they are either U.S. citizens or lawfully present in the U.S. If you are applying for these benefits, you may be asked to provide documentation. Making false statements may result in penalties or loss of benefits.

Health and Immunization Information

In accordance with Tennessee law, students must be informed about certain diseases and the vaccines available to prevent them. I understand this disclosure is made pursuant to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and its regulations at 34 CFR Part 99 and may also be made as an allowed disclosure to an institution where I seek or intend to enroll (34 CFR §99.31(a)(2)). 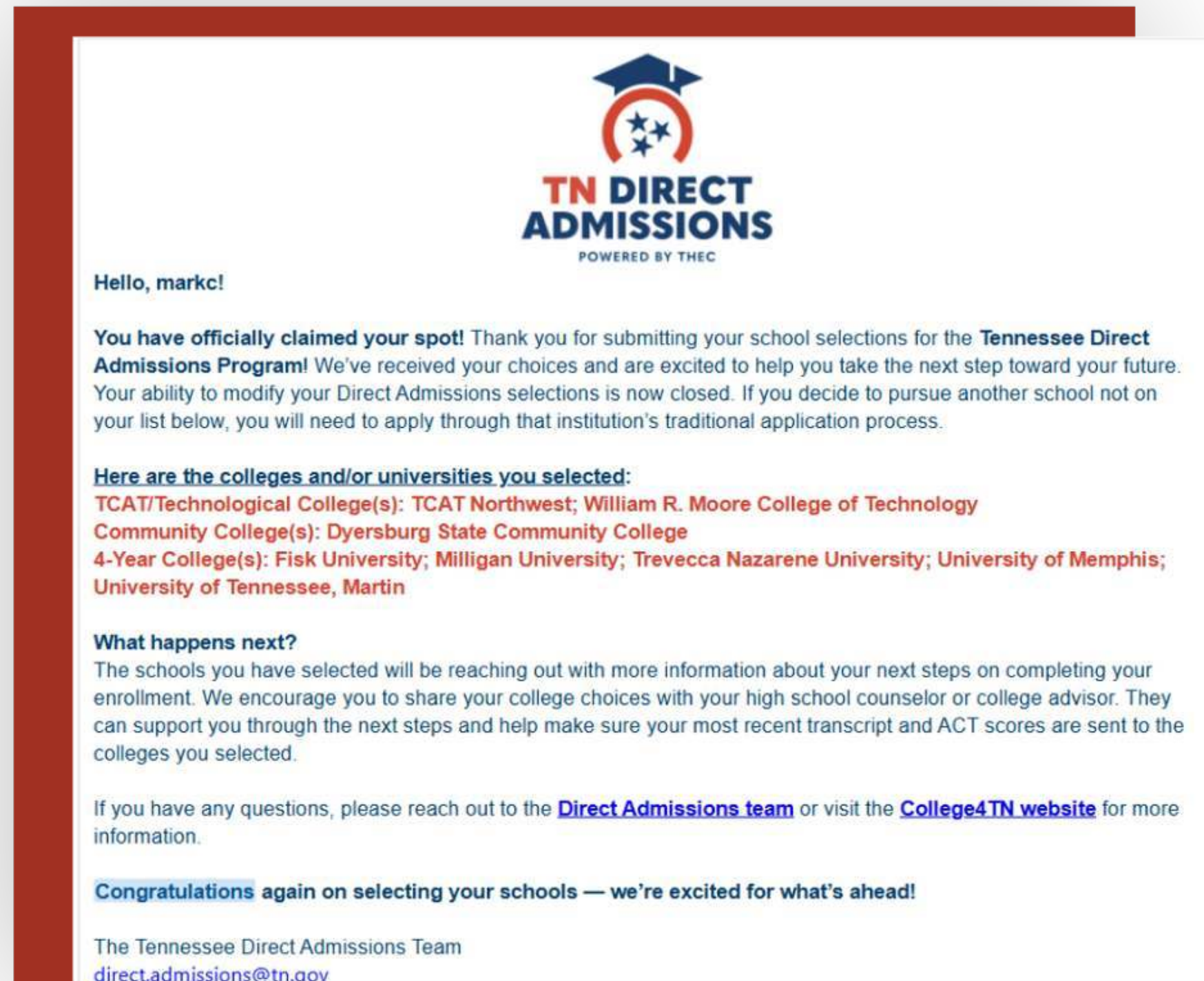
What happens next?
